EXHORTATIONS AND TEACHING

A. Concerning marriage

- 2. Purpose service and the profit of all (not self-boasting or glory)

- 4. All believers are part of the same body and are to minister their gifts to the benefit of that body.
- 5. Not all believers have the same gifts, the plurality of gifts are to serve the church

Anything, great or small done without love profits nothing. Remember to love in all that you do.

E. Gifts are for edification of the church, not elevation of the individual, seek those gifts that edify 14:1-40

Spiritual gifts should be used in an orderly way to serve the church, do not interrupt or talk over one another, serve one another and recognize that God has gifted others as well who also have a part to play in service.

Paul is mentioning that no one person's gifting outweighs another's and that preference should be given to others in their expression of intelligible gifts, commanding them to stop talking when others begin, so they may themselves listen to what God has shared with the other person as well. This speaks to those who were seeking to take up all of the time for themselves, perhaps their own glory, refusing the let others share, or that would interrupt others to be heard themselves. This is not the expression of love he spoke of earlier, but the selfish and carnal nature already rebuked.

VI. CHRIST AND THE BELIEVER'S RESURRECTION

15:1-58

A. Repeating of the Gospel Message and Proofs

15:1-11

Jesus died and rose again and was seen by many witnesses.

B. Paul corrects those who claim there is no resurrection

15:12-19

Paul shares that the entire Christian faith is based both on the resurrection of Christ and the future resurrection of the saints, otherwise there is nothing to look forward to.

C. Yes, Christ has risen from the dead, and so shall we

15:20-28

Christ was the first to rise, paving the way, conquering death – destroying the curse laid upon mankind by Adam. Christ was raised first; the believers will be raised next.

D. Paul reasons further for the resurrection, answering critics

15:29-58

Paul explains all will be changed, not all may die before Christ's return, but all will have to be changed from corruptible to incorruptible. Christ gives the saints victory over death, and our labor is not in vain.
