Each message is catered to the individual church. Many have pros and cons which are addressed, some had only positive, and some only negative. Laodicea for example had no pros, having placed their faith in wealth instead of God. Philadelphia is an example of one that only has positive. Sardis, while negative has a few who have remained faithful which have been recorded as a pro.
