## Joshua

- 5: Israel circumcised as those born in the wilderness had not been, manna ceases as they eat of the land
- 6: Seven days of marching around Jericho with the ark and the walls fell, Rahab and her family spared as promised
- 7: Achan sinned and stole accursed things, causing a curse, was stoned.
- 8: Ai taken, altar made at Mount Ebal, Joshua reads the Book of the Law to all the assembly of Israel- every word.
- 9: Gibeonites deceive Israel with moldy bread, seek treaty pretending to be from far away land and are made slaves when discovered to be local
- 10: Gibeon attacked, Israel defends, sun stands still for a day, the Lord fought for Israel with hailstones
- 11: Northern areas conquered at the waters of Merom and beyond
- 12: List of kings and kingdoms Israel conquered
- 13: The land and inheritance relisted as Joshua is now old

14: Hebron given to Caleb as an inheritance

15: Judah's Portion

16: Ephraim's Portion

17: Manasseh's Portion, both complained about their portion and boasted of their size, Joshua replied if you're so great, go up and clear more land in the mountains for yourselves

18: Tabernacle setup at Shiloh, spies sent out to survey remaining land to be divided among remaining tribes. Tribe of Benjamin's allotment.

19: Tribes of Simeon, Zebulun, Issachar, Asher, Naphtali, and Dan allotments

20: Cities of refuge appointed

21: Levites given cities and fields by lot. Promise fulfilled and rest given on all sides, all promises came to pass.

22: Tribes allowed to return who had taken land on the other side of the Jordan (Reubenites, Gadites, and half the tribe of Manasseh)

23: Joshua meets with the elders and leaders and reminds them if they follow the Lord they will be blessed, otherwise cursed

24: Joshua Reminds Israel of their history and God's faithfulness "choose this day whom you will serve". Joshua and Eleazar die.
