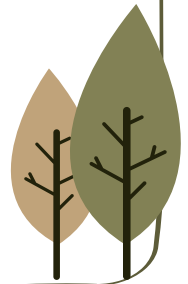

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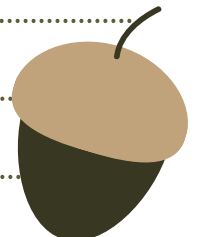

"How to Study Your Bible More Effectively"



Be consistent

Plan out times to study God's Word. We make time for things that are important to us, is knowing God on a deeper level really important to you?

Steer Clear of Distractions

Be aware of what distracts you and know how to steer clear of these distractions. Maybe low-volume instrumental-only music can help.



Get Organized

Carry your Bible around like your phone, or your snacks, or your (whatever is in your pocket right now). Fit in some unplanned time too!

Start Studying More Effectively

Get more out of your study time, be purposeful in taking notes most of the time. Write follow up questions to dwell on. These will come to mind (and get answered) when reading elsewhere in Scripture.



Designate a Study Area

The best study spot is one that is quiet, well-lit, and in a low-traffic area. Don't do it in front of your T.V. or laptop. Put your phone facedown.

Simplify Study Notes

Keep notes short, mark up your Bible. Notches, dashes, underlining to break up subjects and thoughts all work great. Use pencil which is easy to update later on. Erasable color pencils are great as well!
